FAQ: Technical Certificate-Business Administration

Q: What is the Technical Certificate in Business Administration (TC BA)?

A: The TC BA is designed to give students a basic education in business courses that will enable them to secure entry level business jobs. The certificate will qualify the student for an entry level position as a bookkeeper, accounting clerk, bank teller, or retail manager.

Q: How many hours are required for this certificate?

A: Thirty (30) hours are required for this degree. The following chart shows a suggested course of study that allows a student who begins in the fall semester to complete this degree in two semesters.

Q: How am I assigned an advisor?

A: Once you complete the application process and declare a degree, you will be assigned an advisor with expertise in your chosen degree. It is important to develop a good working relationship with your advisor as this is the person who will help guide you through your time at UARM.

Q: How is the Technical Certificate different from the Associate of Applied Science?

A: The AAS is a four-semester program, which includes all of the classes taken for the technical certificate plus additional classes. Most notably, the AAS has math and English requirements.
